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INJURY SURVEILLANCE REFERRAL PROGRAM

Help the Datalys Center advance the NCAA's injury prevention and athlete health and safety efforts!

The Datalys Center is launching a new referral initiative aimed at increasing participation in the NCAA's Injury Surveillance Program.

It's now easier than ever to participate in the Program. This fall the Datalys Center launched a new and improved web-based portal and has expanded its electronic

medical record (EMR) Certified Vendor network to include ATS and Nextt Solutions.

Individual athletic trainers will receive \$250.00 for every new NCAA member institution that they refer and that confirms participation (as evident by data submission) in the NCAA's Injury Surveillance Program between now and March 31, 2010.

When a new institution signs up to participate in the program,

they will be given an opportunity to provide the name and email of the currently participating athletic trainer who referred them to the Datalys Center.

SUBMITTING DATA

Before submitting any data to the Datalys Center, all athletes must sign the NCAA consent form. If an athlete chooses not to sign the form, you will need to reflect this fact in the athletes' electronic file. Once this designation has been made, the Datalys Center will know not to access that athletes information.

You can find the

consent form in the packet of NCAA forms each student-athlete signs at the beginning of the year compliance meeting. The consent form itself should be kept by the institution's Compliance Officer. Information about a student athletes' consent status can be obtained from the Compliance Officer.

Data from

consented student-athletes can be submitted throughout the season and we encourage you to submit your data early and often.

As the season concludes, all data needs to be submitted within three weeks after the last competition for all sports.
